This was a GH¢ 47, 808.00 prove of concept study funded by New York University's School of Medicine, Department of Population Health The primary objective was to evaluate the effect of an integrated mHealth training for Community Health Nurses on retention of diagnostic cervical cancer screening skills using visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA) plus cervicography. The project has trained Community Health Officers currently engaged in Ghana Essential Health Intervention Project (GEHIP) to screen women in the Ga East Municipal for cervical cancer using cervicography.
