## > Assessing the HIV care cascade in key populations in the Greater Accra Region of Ghana: a pilot study.

This study is being undertaken with Dr. Amos Laar acting as Co-PI/Local PI and Dr. Bismark Sarfo. It seeks to characterize the extent to which the steps in the HIV care cascade are achieved for key populations (FSW, MSM, PWID, and PMTCT) in the greater Accra region of Ghana and to explore the individual- (e.g. sociodemographics characteristics, etc.), social- (e.g. social support and social network factors, etc.) and structural- (e.g. availability, access and uptake of HIV related services, etc.) level factors related to disparities in achieving the HIV care cascade steps across key population groups in Ghana. It also will explore structural and programmatic barriers to successfully achieving the HIV care cascade. The funder is Novartis Foundation, Basel, Switzerland Global Challenge Grant Award provided by the Global Institute of Public Health at New York University. The amount is USD 14,990 and was done in collaboration with New York University, Global Institute of Public Health.
